Inviting proximity and amplifying diverse perspectives from the Borderlands

Abara Border Encounters:

Abara's Border Encounter Program provides community leaders with a three-day immersive experience on the U.S.-Mexico Border. Through proximity to global neighbors and asylum seekers, powerful storytelling, discussions examining immigration law, current realities, and the history of forced displacement, as well as powerful times of reflection and circle processing, Abara Border Encounters offer participants a transformative space that challenges perceived beliefs, deepens faith, strengthens values, and clarifies next steps. Abara House will be the future home for Border Encounters. Sitting directly along the southern border fence with onsite apartments and reflective spaces to process, Border Encounters will serve as one of several income-generating initiatives that collectively sustain over 60% of Abara House operations.

BORDER ENCOUNTER PROGRAM

Sample Curriculum:

- Dignified Storytelling and Ethical Volunteerism

Amplifying the heartbeat of the borderlands through mutual hospitality on both sides of the Río Grande

Abara Border Response:

El Paso and Ciudad Juárez collectively serve as a global hub welcoming tens of thousands of forcibly displaced neighbors to the region each year. This binational hospitality effort is fueled by a network of faith communities, government initiatives, and non-profits who together operate over 30 migrant shelters on both sides of the Río Grande. Abara partners with this network by facilitating connections, support and the flow of resources, coming alongside frontline leaders and shelters to strengthen the hand of these welcoming communities. Border Response has been a central focus of Abara since its inception. As the dream of Abara House becomes a reality, this Borderland Center will serve as a central hub supporting Abara's Border Response initiatives.











BORDER + RESPONSE PROGRAMS

Shelter Resourcing

Collecting, warehousing, and distributing supplies including meals, hygiene and cleaning products; repairing shelter infrastructure and appliances; mobilizing funding and volunteers

Huellas Microenterprise

A structured course offering life skills and leadership equipping; opportunities for shelter guests to earn income through soap and jewerly making

Leader Care

Hosting fellowship events for migrant leaders to share a meal and receive an encouraging word from a local speaker; respite care through sponsored get aways for shelter leaders and their spouses and providing coverage of responsibilities in their absence

Accompaniment

Hospital visits, bereavement support, communal action; health education and gynecological care

Youth + Children

Art therapy and recreation classes for unaccompanied minors; field trips to museums and cultural sites for teens

Asylum Narrative Translation Project

Trauma-informed translation and transcription services to capture shelter guests story of forced displacement that is required throughout the asylum legal process
